Eugene Quay, Attorney, Dies at 79

Eugene Quay, 79, an attorney and expert in constitutional law, died yesterday in his home at 7512 N. Rogers Av. after a lengthy illness. Mr. Quay was the husband of Effie Alley Quay, who served as science and medical writer for several years for Chicago Today and its predecessor, Chicago's American.

He received a degree in constitutional history from Catholic University of America, and a law degree from Georgetown University. He later published several monographs on constitutional and legal aspects of abortion. Among them was a study, "Justifiable Abortion," published in the Georgetown Law Journal, a magazine he founded and served as first editor.

Besides his wife, Mr. Quay is survived by a son, the Rev. Paul M. Quay, S. J., and a sister. Mass will be said at 10 a. m. Monday in St. Jerome Catholic Church, 1709 W. Lunt Av.
